Course Catalog Description:

Theory and practice of stage makeup

Course Objectives: This course is designed to give you an overview of theatrical makeup application. At the end of this course the successful student will be able to:

- ➤ Analyze a photo to reproduce characteristics in makeup
- Effectively use highlight and shadow to emphasize and alter the face in makeup
- > Understand proper proportion of facial features and how to alter them
- > Effectively use the basic materials and supplies used in theatrical makeup applications
- > Understand the basics of Wigs, Hairpieces, and Facial Hair
- > Be able to design and execute makeup for characters in theatrical productions

Course Philosophy: I believe students are as much responsible for their own education as their professors. It is imperative that you read the textbook and do your research before coming to class. Only then will you be able to grow beyond your current skills.

Headband or Bandana to hold back hair

Make-up Remover—Cold Cream or Mineral Oil

Two Towels and One Washcloth(labeled with name or initials)

Camera (I recommend at least one 15 exposure disposable camera with flash)

Box of 8 colored pencils plus flesh color

Also recommend small variety of eye shadow colors

Container of baby wipes

Scissors

Comb or Brush

Other Materials as needed for your makeup designs

Assignments: Each week you must bring four pieces of research for that week's assignment. At least two pieces must be in color. Your research should be no smaller than 2" by 2" and must have good resolution. In class you will then do your makeup design using your colored pencils following the demonstration. The next class you will do your makeup application. Makeup Application will be graded on effort, neatness, and improvement more than skill. Your makeup design will be done in class on the demo day. You must have your research with you in order to do your schematic. If you do not have your research both your research and schematic will be counted late and 5 points deducted from each. Your research and design must be completed before you do your makeup application.

Final Project: You must select and have approved your final makeup design. It can be a character from a play or something from your imagination, however in either case you must have research to support your choices. Final Makeup Designs will be done on the last day of class or during our regularly scheduled final exam time which is April 20 from 7am to 9:50 am.

Final Makeup Folder: Your final makeup folder is a neatly arranged portfolio of your work this semester. It must include all of your research, makeup designs, and photos (including final project) of your makeup applications. This will be due by NOON APRIL 26, 2004. An additional Makeup Morgue research section is strongly suggested and should be divided into men, women, horror, ethnic, facial hair, etc.

Attendance Policy: I understand that you all have other classes and obligations pulling you in many directions. If you need to be gone from class for any reason please let me know ahead of time, but please do not ask me for permission. This class is important too. It is your responsibility to sign the daily attendance sheet. If your signature is not on the attendance sheet, you will be counted absent. Please note that three tardies equals one absence. If you have more than three unexcused absences your final grade will be lowered.

Missed Assignments: There is one day in the schedule to allow for makeup projects if you miss a project lab day. You must complete all assignments in this class to get a passing grade so you may not choose to skip an assignment. This makeup day can also be used to redo a project you are not particularly proud of and would like to improve your grade on.

Clean up Day: Each Student will be assigned a clean up day and will be responsible for cleaning the counters and sink, starting the laundry, etc. FAILURE TO COMPLETE THE ASSIGNED CLEANUP DAY WILL RESULT IN THE LOWERING OF THE STUDETNS FINAL LETTER GRADE. We will sign up for clean up days on the first day of class.

Student Models for Demo Days: I will take volunteers to serve as the model for each demo day. You can sign up for this on the first day of class. If you volunteer to be the model you are responsible for bringing all of your supplies. You will disappoint me if you sign up for a demo day and don't show up...
